- Enrollment management and student fees and financial aid is important for UCSA to keep any tuition increases on the table and keeping matters on the issue of nonresidents brought in and how that influences admission slots in mind, since that all influences the quality and demographic of the university.
- The Graduate experience is just as important as the Undergraduate experience.
- Kudos to all of you on the board as this is indeed a burden for most students, but on the campus level administrators are listening and appreciate the work you all do.



- Susan Allen Ortega: Offer self as a liaison. TESS scores committee does not currently have a student on that committee.
- The work is going to be moving very quickly on a review of what federal requirements articulated are, as well as what came out of the audits at Berkeley and LA.
- Want to ensure that, at the beginning stages, we are looking at all the recommendations and have all the work done at the end of August with a recommendation for the system that can help use become a better system for all students.
- If there are things that have not been shared but that you want to share, please get in contact with her. We are keeping a list of all individuals who want to get involved and hope you all do so if you have something you want to say.
- Mental health is also being reviewed, including advocacy for additional information and services for students.
- Where the system is right now, is that we are wrapping up
 a grant that has helped reduce suicide and increase the
 services we have. There is a plan and all those able to
 participate should participate in a summit, which is a joint
 venture between the UC, CSUs, and CC's.
- We also want synergy with UCSA in a conversation about

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	funding. The student services fee has been flat and that	
	influences the services that can be served, but what we	
	do does influence pocket books and we want that to be	
	balanced. We want your assistance to inform what we	
	should be doing and how to promote best practices.

So Merced wants to put a bid in and willing to take on the burden. No conference hosted at UC Merced before and we believe it is a good time to do so. Intercultural education needed at campus and so it would be the best for the campus. Also have dates for November. Wanted to know if everyone wants to do a straw poll vote for dates and whether students want to have it in Merced.
