- Water issues
- CSU got debt restructuring this year, UC saw it last year
- LAO's Review
 - Revenue assumptions are relatively conservative
 - Income tax is increasing dramatically
 - Almost an additional billion dollars just with February report, does not account for April tax date
- UC budget
 - Only 6.8 Billion is the core budget directed towards instruction
 - Balance between portion coming from General Fund and another portion coming through state
 - 5% general fund and no revenue on tuition side this year
 - 2.48% increase overall
 - Revenue assumptions three different areas
 - Mandatory costs collective bargaining (\$168.1m), high-priority costs (\$165.0m) – additional enrollment growth, and academic quality (\$50m)
 - Need another \$125m to address retirement costs, health benefit costs, enrollment growth
 - Could put \$300m +/- one-time funds back into UC budget instead of just filling current deficit
 - These are the institutions and services that get cut first, deferred maintenance
 - Challenge has been for state funding to complement UC funding



- State wants UC to take more transfers and more California residents
 - Community colleges about 2% enrollment growth, supposed to get 3% enrollment growth next year
 - These students will soon be entering CSU and UC
 - Unless state provides funding, we cannot serve these students
- Where do the state's priority lie?
 - Corrections
 - K-12 Education (Prop 98)
 - UC has only had an 11% increase in funding by the state since 1990-1991, that's less than 1% per year
- Working Smarter Initiative
 - Reducing the cost of instruction, but it's important to not jeopardize the quality of the UC at the same time
 - Even if our ability is to move students through in a more timely fashion, can only take in a few more students if UC is still not hiring more faculty
 - Each student is different...
 they have different
 circumstances
- WE ARE NOT RAISING TUITON IN 2014-2015.
 - UC needs to create a tuition and financial aid policy that is predictable
- UCSA campaigns and UCOP support



- Corrections budget is a black hole. UC has an expectation to achieve extraordinary things, but corrections are still prioritized over higher education.
- o Prop 13 Reform: Lenz is in favor of it
- Oil Severance Tax: Support bill if amended, additional administrative structure to allocate revenue. (Never going to happen). Why set up another bureaucratic structure?
 - Means in which it is distributed doesn't make sense
 - CSU has a funding guarantee under Prop 98, yet they're included
 - UC is the only system without a dedicated revenue source from the state
 - We're competing against corrections and health and human services
- Maryssa: What do you mean by reinvestment in academic quality?
 - Increasing growth of faculty-to-student ratio
 - On average, it's 26:1
 - UC got to a point where they were losing more faculty than they could retain
 - Graduate student support, expand graduate programs
 - Bridge faculty and staff compensation to make competitive with other institutions
- o Tony: Tuition in the future ...?
 - Does not believe that no tuition increase is sustainable
 - No tuition increase hurts neediest students (1/3 return to aid)
 - Families making less that 80k have costs that are rising
 - Governor does not raise tuition until after Prop 30 is exhausted
 - 1996 –Tuition Policy for state (sunsetted)

	 Trying to maintain the state's commitment to stop dramatic tuition increases Guillermo: Cost of instruction, asked UC to evaluate average cost Trying to find common norms between all campuses to access value to a cost to education One of the biggest challenges is evaluating how to weigh faculty's time, lab time Lenz doesn't understand why they need to do this Get about \$10k from state per student Lower cost for lower div, higher cost for higher div Because we're serving 7500 more students than the state is funding, it lowers the number down to \$6800 per student
