Bid Process and Requirements

About the Student of Color Conference

The purpose of the Students of Color Conference is to provide safe space for students of color to educate each other and strategize around statewide and campus-based actions.

SOCC is co-hosted by UCSA and a single University of California campus, as selected by the UCSA Board of Directors. SOCC has occurred annually since 1988.

The University of California Student Association is the official voice of 245,000 undergraduate, graduate, and professional students from all ten UC campuses. It is our mission to advocate on behalf of current and future students for the accessibility, affordability, and quality of the University of California system.

Submitting a Bid to Host the Student of Color Conference

The Student of Color Conference bid is a dual-pronged proposal that includes a 15-20 minute presentation and a written application. Both the written application and presentation is due at least 2 weeks prior to the December Board meeting. All materials should be submitted to UCSA's Statewide Organizing Director at organizing@ucsa.org. Please review the following guidelines which distinguish the roles and responsibilities of campus host and UCSA. Lastly, in order to submit a bid, the applicant must be actively engaged with UCSA's Racial Justice Now Campaign.



How is SOCC Planned - Hybrid Planning Team
